Ensure that hazardous wastes and wastes with health risks are treated and disposed of in accordance with

international safety standards;

- Develop/implement SWM Public Awareness & Communication programs;
- Stimulate the involvement of NGOs/CBOs and the private sector.

PLANNED ACTIVITIES

- Establishment of SWM collection/transport facilities and
